Week 7 - Statement of Faith: The Church

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We believe in the universal church, a living spiritual body of which Christ is the head and all regenerated persons are members. We believe in the local church, consisting of a company of believers in Jesus Christ, baptized on a credible confession of faith, and associated for worship, work and fellowship. We believe that God has laid upon the members of the local church the primary tasks of living a life of worship, nurturing the body of believers and giving the gospel of Jesus Christ to a lost world.

Living Spiritual Body

We believe in the universal church, a living spiritual body of which Christ is the head and all regenerated persons are members.

Read aloud: Ephesians 2:19-22 (NIV)

¹⁹ Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, ²⁰ built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. ²¹ In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. ²² And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.

Regeneration:

Read aloud: At Hope, we think that all believers are sent and should be "on mission;" however, for clarity of terms, we use "missions" to describe those who are pursuing being "on mission" in a cross-cultural manner. Local Church

We believe in the local church, consisting of a company of believers in Jesus Christ, baptized on a credible confession of faith, and associated for worship, work and fellowship.

Next we're going to read a few passages about the local church. As we read, listen for the characteristics of what a local church is or should do.

Ephesians 5:19-21 (NIV)

¹⁹ speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, ²⁰ always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. ²¹ Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Acts 2:42-47 (NIV)

⁴² They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³ Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Hebrews 10:23-25 (NIV)

²³ Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, ²⁵ not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.



Based on the passages we read, what are some of the characteristics of a local church? What should a local church do or be?



What role does our small group play in the local church?



Each passage references fellowship, being together, or speaking to one another. In what ways does our group already do this? Are there any ways our small group can pursue community more deeply?



In what ways can our small group encourage one another and experience fellowship in times when we may not be able to physically meet or be together?



One way to formally practice this is to become a member of a local church. What might be some benefits of officially becoming a member of a church? What privileges come with that?

Article 5 recap from Hope's constitution: Positional vs Church member

Positional member: every individual who has made a personal profession of faith in Jesus Christ as lord and Savior is a "positional member" of the universal Body of Christ and should be given an opportunity to use their God-given gifts and resources to serve Him and further the Kingdom of God.

Church member: individuals who God calls to grow by becoming church members in a specific, local fellowship united with common Biblical beliefs and a common sense of mission. Positional members in Christ have an invisible bond, but church members have a visible bond established among the members of Hope Community Church.

Living a Life of Worship

We believe that God has laid upon the members of the local church the primary tasks of living a life of worship, nurturing the body of believers and giving the gospel of Jesus Christ to a lost world.

Read aloud: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11 (NIV)

⁴There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. ⁵There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. ⁶There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work. ⁷Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. ⁸To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, ⁹to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, ¹⁰to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.

? Spiritual Gifts are for the common good to build up the body of believers. What gifts or talents have you been given that can be of service to the church? Have you taken action to use them?

? How can we encourage fellow believers in their giftings?
