# DISCUSSION OVERVIEW

This discussion will look at the idea of living an individual life, yet looking outward to listen and love others well, thanks to the work of the gospel in our life.

### **SERIES OVERVIEW**

This series will explore how the church can play a role in affecting positive change. The gospel, rather than politics or worldly power or wealth or social media or reclusiveness, changes everything.

- How does this affect our small group?
- How can you be a faithful presence in your life?

When was the last time you were with a great listener? How did you feel leaving that conversation?

**BOOK** What does Scripture say about this?

### Proverbs 18:13

<sup>13</sup>To answer before listening—that is folly and shame.

### Isaiah 30:21

Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you, saying, "This is the way; walk in it."

### Philippians 2:1-4

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, <sup>2</sup> then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. <sup>3</sup> Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, <sup>4</sup> not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

### James 1:19

<sup>19</sup> My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry

#### I Corinthians 1:18

<sup>18</sup> For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

# How does the gospel call us to more than simply a "me-centric" lifestyle?

Potential answers: the gospel offers us life, we are called to listen, we can care for others in the same mind as Christ did, etc.

# How do we as a small group do this well? Where are areas of growth we can work on together?

Potential answers: our accountability time is amazing! Checking in with each other midweek is always an honest conversation. We could do a better job letting everyone's voice be heard. Our midweek check in is lacking depth.

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# Story of the Good News of Jesus.

#### Creation

God makes all things and they are good

#### Fall

God's people turn away from God, things are broken. Death and sin rule over all things.

### Redemption

God, through Jesus' death and resurrection, rescues his people and defeats death and sin.

#### Restoration

Jesus returns to be with his people, end all brokenness, and make all things right.

#### THE GOSPEL The Good News of lesus

We see Jesus listen & care for others vs. simply putting his glory in the forefront – how can we do that in our daily lives?

Potential answers: remain grounded in His word, pray for humility, set aside preferences, encourage others more than we criticize them, listen well, etc.

Which aspects of your self-promotion, self-sufficiency or self-reliance do you need more of Jesus' power to take control over this week?
