




The Gospel of Mark



WARM-UP

Sometimes those who do good things for others can get overwhelmed by the NEED people present them with in repeated contexts, i.e. donating money or time, or doing favors. Talk about a time when you or someone you know struggled with how much to give in a situation where there was more need than could be met.



What happened last week in the book of Mark?

MARK 1:21-34 (NIV)

21 They went to Capernaum, and when the Sabbath came, Jesus went into the synagogue and began to teach. 22 The people were amazed at his teaching, because he taught them as one who had authority, not as the teachers of the law. 23 Just then a man in their synagogue who was possessed by an impure spirit cried out, 24 "What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" 25 "Be quiet!" said Jesus sternly. "Come out of him!" 26 The impure spirit shook the man violently and came out of him with a shriek.

27 The people were all so amazed that they asked each other, "What is this? A new teaching—and with authority! He even gives orders to impure spirits and they obey him." 28 News about him spread quickly over the whole region of Galilee.

29 As soon as they left the synagogue, they went with James and John to the home of Simon and Andrew. 30 Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they immediately told Jesus about her. 31 So he went to her, took her hand and helped her up. The fever left her and she began to wait on them.

32 That evening after sunset the people brought to Jesus all the sick and demon-possessed. 33 The whole town gathered at the door, 34 and Jesus healed many who had various diseases. He also drove out many demons, but he would not let the demons speak because they knew who he was.



What stands out to you?



The people noticed Jesus' authority in teaching and then in casting out demons. Do you think it's important that Jesus started with teaching? Why?



Jesus was giving both his message (the kingdom of God is near) and using his gifts (healing and casting out demons). Why do you think that people seemed to value one more than the other? How can we appreciate the eternal Good News that Jesus brought as much as the temporary healing that Jesus did?

MARK 1:35-45 (NIV)

35 Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. 36 Simon and his companions went to look for him, 37 and when they found him, they exclaimed: "Everyone is looking for you!"

38 Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else—to the nearby villages—so I can preach there also. That is why I have come." 39 So he traveled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.

40 A man with leprosy ^h came to him and begged him on his knees, "If you are willing, you can make me clean."

41 Jesus was indignant. ⁱ He reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!" 42 Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cleansed.

43 Jesus sent him away at once with a strong warning: 44 "See that you don't tell this to anyone. But go, show yourself to the priest and offer the sacrifices that Moses commanded for your cleansing, as a testimony to them." 45 Instead he went out and began to talk freely, spreading the news. As a result, Jesus could no longer enter a town openly but stayed outside in lonely places. Yet the people still came to him from everywhere.

"The law required unclean people to live outside the camp until they were free of disease and to present a sacrifice as part of a cleansing ceremony. The purpose of this law was to prevent what is unclean from coming into contact with what is holy, which would be dangerous for the unclean person and for the whole community. The law did not imply that the unclean person was under God's condemnation or that he or she would be excluded from the love of the community"
