Because of the divine blessing it is appropriate to call it a covenant. Its purpose is above all to fulfill mankind's relationship with God as it was originally intended. Second, the commandment is to be fruitful, multiply, and fill the earth. The population was to increase and then fill the earth to discover its possibilities. Third, the mandate orders that mankind subdue the earth. The word for subduing (kabash) is not meant to be violent, but gentle. It is perhaps not coincidental that the three aspects of the mandate are reflected in our English word (inherited from the Medieval French) for "culture." Cult referring to worship is one derivative. Colonization meaning to spread to other

parts of the world is another. And *coulter* means, literally, the cutting edge of the plow, or what we ordinarily call cultivation. This is the creation mandate. This is the purpose of the human race.
