

Church is such a crazy business model if you think about it!


They demand 2-10 hours of your week, 10% of your wages, and in exchange they stunt your emotional growth and tell you how awful you are.

Ephesians 3:1–13

¹ For this reason I, Paul, the prisoner of Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles — ² Surely you have heard about the administration of God's grace that was given to me for you, ³ that is, the mystery made known to me by revelation, as I have already written briefly. ⁴ In reading this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵ which was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to God's holy apostles and prophets.

One word that comes up the most in this whole passage is the word mystery. Paul says it's his job to proclaim a mystery. What does the word mystery mean? When you and I hear the English word mystery, it actually conveys something that is almost the opposite of what Paul means by it, so we have a little bit of a translation problem. When you and I think of a mystery, you think of ... what? Something hidden from you that it's your job to discover...


The Greek word, especially as Paul uses it, means exactly the opposite. It means, not something hidden that you have to discover. It means something revealed by God because you would never discover it, because it's so counterintuitive, because you would never come to the conclusion of it by a process of reasoning. In other words, a mystery is an astonishing, counterintuitive revelation, something revealed to you that's astounding, that goes completely against

Ephesians 2:4-5, 8-9

⁴ But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy,

⁵ made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in
transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved…⁸ For it is by
grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from
yourselves, it is the gift of God—⁹ not by works, so that no one can
boast.


