Likewise, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

Romans 8:13

For, if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.







How do you relate to something the church largely doesn't talk about? How do you recognize God in the Spirit when our culture focuses on the tangibles. The Holy Spirit is sooo subjective. After all, if I misread His work in my life and say something is the work of the Holy Spirit when it is really simply an act of my flesh, won't the Holy Spirit lose credibility to those I am telling about His work in my life? It's better just to not talk about the HS, not proclaim His work in my life. It's easier to focus on the Father and the Son. This was my thinking prior to 2 years ago and is often the thinking I run into with other believers who are so quick to question whether or not you are hearing, sensing or being lead by the Holy Spirit. They would rather stick with the authority of the scriptures (this is a good thing!) because they are tangible. In this way, the Holy Spirit gets put on the back burner...referenced from time to time. Few are willing to peel back the layers of the third person of the Trinity.






