

I have worked much harder, been in prison more frequently, been flogged more severely, and been exposed to death again and again. ²⁴ Five times I received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. ²⁵ Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was pelted with stones, three times I was shipwrecked, I spent a night and a day in the open sea.

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- 4. Intense opposition from Jews

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- 1. The riot in Ephesus (Acts 19:23-20:1)
- 2. A flare-up of some illness that was nearly fatal
- 3. An unrecorded imprisonment when he faced execution
- 4. Intense opposition from Jews
- 5. Nothing specific metaphor for relationship between him and the church

6. Paul's interpretation of his deadly peril Don't rely on ourselves but God

A. He raises the dead! 2 Corinthians 1:9b-11

^{9b}But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead. ¹⁰He has delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us. On him we have set our hope that he will continue to deliver us, ¹¹as you help us by your prayers. Then many will give thanks on our behalf for the gracious favor granted us in answer to the prayers of many.

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B. He delivers us. 2 Corinthians 1:9b-11
