
A Culture where "Sex is Everything"

Sexual addiction or hypersexuality is defined as a dysfunctional preoccupation with sexual fantasy, often in combination with the obsessive pursuit of casual or non-intimate sex; pornography; compulsive masturbation; romantic intensity and objectified partner sex for a period of at least six months.

A Culture where "Sex is Everything"

"There still remains four irreducible objections to religious faith: that it wholly misrepresents the origins of man and the cosmos, that because of this original error it manages to combine the maximum of servility with the maximum of solipsism, that it is both the result and the cause of dangerous sexual repression, and that it is

A (Church) Culture where Sex is Nothing

"Intercourse performed licitly (i.e. permissibly) is an occasion of sin, unless done purely to beget children."

A (Church) Culture where Sex is Nothing

Origen (AD 185 -254) – Allegorized Song of Solomon

Gregory of Nyssa (AD 335-394) – Adam and Eve created without sexual desire

Jerome (AD 347-420) – Punished himself physically when tempted

Augustine (AD 354-430) – Commended married couples for not engaging in sex

Thomas Aquinas (AD 1225-1274) – Sex permissible only for purposes of procreation

#2 - To be received as a gift 1 Corinthians 7:1-3


1 Now concerning the matters about which you wrote: "It is good for a man not to have sexual relations with a woman." 2 But because of the temptation to sexual immorality, each man should have his own wife and each woman her own husband. 3 The husband should give to his wife her conjugal rights, and likewise the wife to her husband.


A Culture where "Sex is Nothing"

Perhaps the most extreme examples I (Mark) have encountered were multiple young couples from strict religious upbringings at a conference in Minnesota. In conversations throughout the course of the day, I repeatedly had Christian couples, who had been married a year or more, asking when I thought they

should consummate their relationship and have sex for the first time...Most wrongly thought that sex was for procreation alone and not pleasure.
