
The Gospel of John ~ Part Two:

Astronomical Distance

Speed of Light – 186,000 miles per second

Light would travel around the earth at the Equator over 7 times per second

Distance to the Moon is 2.5 light seconds

Distance to the Sun is 8 light *minutes*

Distance to Pluto is 4.5 light hours

Distance to nearest star is 3.5 light years

If everything were reduced in size by a factor of a billion.

- Then the Earth would be about the size of a grape. The Moon would be a foot from the Earth
- The Sun would be about 5 feet in diameter and about a city block from the Earth
- Jupiter would be the size of a large grapefruit and 5 blocks away from the Sun
- Saturn, the size of an orange, would be 10 blocks away
- Uranus and Neptune, lemons, 20 and 30 blocks away
- A human on this scale would be the size of an atom
- But the nearest star would be over 24,000 miles away!!
