Receiving and Giving it away

#### The Magnitude of the Question

#### Matthew 18:21-35

<sup>21</sup>Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me?

Up to seven times?"

#### A New Standard

<sup>22</sup>Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.

Scene One – Accounts Need to Be Settled
Matthew 18:23-25

<sup>23</sup>"Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. <sup>24</sup>As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him.
<sup>25</sup>Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt.

Scene Two - "But I can't pay!"
Matthew 18:26-27

<sup>26</sup>"The servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' <sup>27</sup>The servant's master took pity on him, cancelled the debt and let him go.

Scene Three - "Pay me back what you owe me!"

Matthew 18:28-31

<sup>28</sup>"But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow-servants who owed him a hundred denarii. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded.

<sup>29</sup>"His fellow-servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.'

<sup>30</sup>"But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. <sup>31</sup>When the other servants saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed and went and told their master everything that had happened.

Scene Four - The master's response to the servant's lack of forgiveness

Matthew 18:28-31

32"Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I cancelled all that debt of yours because you begged me to.
33Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow-servant just as I had on you?' 34In anger his master turned him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.

#### Jesus' ultimate point:

Forgiveness is not optional for those who have been forgiven

Matthew 18:35

<sup>35</sup>"This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother from your heart."

1. Prayer for the reminder of how much your debt was.
THE TOP OF THE STAIRS



2. Prayer for the Holy Spirit to move you to forgive. THE DESCENT DOWN THE STAIRS, part 1.



3. Pray for them, wish well upon them. THE DESCENT DOWN THE STAIRS, part 2.



4. Release, through prayer, that person from any debt of hatred, malice or anger you have against them and hand them over to God.

THE INTERACTION AT THE BOTTOM OF THE STAIRS



"I believe [unforgiveness] is keeping more people from having power with God than any other thing -- they are not willing to cultivate the spirit of forgiveness. If we allow the root of bitterness to spring up in our hearts against someone, our prayer will not be answered. It may not be an easy thing to live in sweet fellowship with all those with whom we come in contact; but that is what the grace of God is given to us for."
