Luke 11:1-4

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In a sense, what Jesus says in this passage was of life and death significance for him, for it contained some words that his opponents would seize upon to charge him with blasphemy, a charge that would eventually bring about his death. It is so commonplace for each one of us today, that we hardly notice the significance of it at all. The radical part of the prayer comes at the very beginning, when Jesus tells them to address God as 'Father'. Now the vast majority of Christians, when they pray, address God as Father. This is something that we take for granted. But at this point in history, when the prayer was first uttered, it was an innovation of the most radical sort.

⁵ Then Jesus said to them, “Suppose you have a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say, ‘Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; ⁶ a friend of mine on a journey has come to me, and I have no food to offer him.’ ⁷ And suppose the one inside answers, ‘Don’t bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can’t get up and give you anything.’ ⁸ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of friendship, yet because of your shameless audacity he will surely get up and give you as much as you need.

The late arrival of the traveler confronted the householder with an embarrassing situation, because his larder was empty and he could not fulfil the sacred obligations of hospitality. Late as it was, he went out to borrow from a friend. The friend's door was shut. In this part of the world no one would knock on a shut door unless the need was imperative. In the morning the door was opened and remained open all day, for there was little privacy; but if the door was shut, that was a definite sign that the householder did not wish to be disturbed. But the seeking householder was not deterred. He knocked, and kept on knocking.

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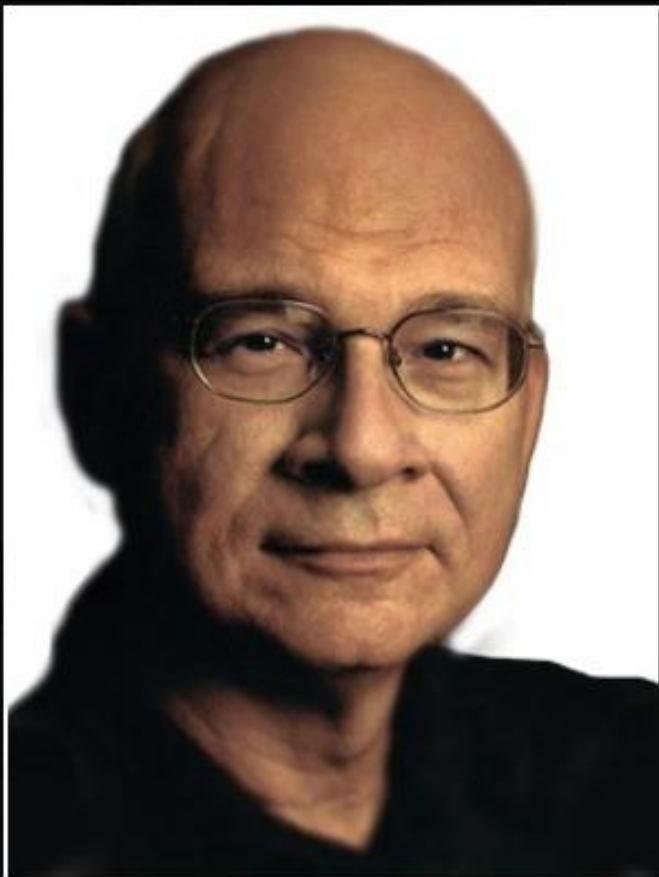
