










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CHAPTERS 12-16

1. Know your role

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The offering of the living bodies of believers as sacrifices contrasts with the OT offerings of dead animals. Here the word 'body' represents far more than just our belongings or our money. It means the totality of our life, plans and activities. The offering of ourselves is a spiritual act of worship that we can give to God. Through our bodies we express what we think, what we have and how we live.

² He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world.

1. Know your role

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This is critical to understand: our vocations are not how we make a living but how life has made us. Has life made you a son or daughter, mother or father, husband or wife, boss or employee, leader or citizen? Those are your callings, your vocations. And nobody has just one. On the day of my birth, for instance, I was a son, brother, and citizen of the United States. I wasn't even out of diapers and God had already called me into three vocations! Over time, I entered even more callings. I became a husband, father, grandfather, and employee..."

The premodern world had it right: open your eyes and look around to see where you live, who you live with, and what they do... There, written in the lives of those people, are your callings. God has summoned you to care for them. To love them. To sacrifice your time, your sweat, your dollars — all of yourself — to serve them... It's not some deep mystery we have to solve by penciling in the ovals on career aptitude tests, searching our hearts, & attending job fairs. We can't unearth it because it's not buried. 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


