


This cultural promise of making the world controllable, not only does not "work" but in fact becomes distorted into its exact opposite. The scientifically, technologically, economically, and politically controllable world mysteriously seems to elude us or to close itself off from us. It withdraws from us, becoming mute and unreadable...Everything out there is dead, gray, empty, and cold, and everything within me is mute and numb, too.

[On burnout]: it is not the frequency of diagnosis (for which there may be many different reasons) that strikes me as significant here, but the fact that even those who are not objectively threatened by either burnout or depression are nevertheless obsessively interested in the phenomenon and perceive it to be a threat. My hypothesis is that the fundamental fear of modernity is fear of the world's falling mute, of which burnout and depression are only a timely (and perhaps heightened) OF THE WORLD expression." HARTMUT ROSA






