



<sup>10</sup>The Lord has brought over you a deep sleep: He has sealed your eyes (the prophets); he has covered your heads (the seers).




#### I won't. I can't.

#### Isaiah 29:9-14

<sup>11</sup>For you this whole vision is nothing but words sealed in a scroll. And if you give the scroll to someone who can read, and say to him, "Read this, please," he will answer, "I can't; it is sealed." <sup>12</sup>Or if you give the scroll to someone who cannot read, and say, "Read this, please," he will answer, "I don't know how to read."

The double illustration covers those who can but cannot be bothered and those who cannot and do not care. Basic to both is a spirit of unconcern. The one will not exert himself to break the seal and read, nor does the other



urge him to do so. Thus self-adopted and Spirit-induced spiritual somnolence is evidenced in indolence (11) and disinterest (12).



#### God of wonders


#### Isaiah 29:9-14

On the whole, I do not find Christians, outside of the catacombs, sufficiently sensible of conditions. Does anyone have the foggiest idea what sort of power we so blithely invoke? Or, as I suspect, does no one believe a word of it? The churches are children playing on the floor with their chemistry sets, making up a batch of TNT to kill a Sunday morning. It is madness to wear ladies hats and straw hats and velvet hats to church; we should all be

wearing crash helmets. Ushers should issue life preservers and signal flares; they should lash us to our pews. For the sleeping god may wake someday and take offence, or the waking god may draw us out to where we can never return.

<sup>1</sup>Then some Pharisees and teachers of the law came to Jesus from Jerusalem and asked, <sup>2</sup>"Why do your disciples break the tradition of the elders? They don't wash their hands before they eat!"

<sup>3</sup>Jesus replied, "And why do you break the command of God for the sake of your tradition? <sup>4</sup>For God said, 'Honor your father and mother' and 'Anyone who curses their father or mother is to be put to death.' 5But you say that if anyone declares that what might have been used to help their father or mother is 'devoted to God,' 6they are not to 'honor their father or mother' with it. Thus you nullify the word of God for the sake of your tradition.

<sup>7</sup>You hypocrites! Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you:

"These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me.
They worship me in vain; their teachings are merely human rules."

<sup>10</sup>Jesus called the crowd to him and said, "Listen and understand. <sup>11</sup>What goes into someone's mouth does not defile them, but what comes out of their mouth, that is what defiles them."

<sup>12</sup>Then the disciples came to him and asked, "Do you know that the Pharisees were offended when they heard this?"

<sup>13</sup>He replied, "Every plant that my heavenly Father has not planted will be pulled up by the roots. <sup>14</sup>Leave them; they are blind guides. If the blind lead the blind, both will fall into a pit."

<sup>15</sup>Peter said, "Explain the parable to us."

<sup>16</sup>"Are you still so dull?" Jesus asked them. <sup>17</sup>"Don't you see that whatever enters the mouth goes into the stomach and then out of the body? 18But the things that come out of a person's mouth come from the heart, and these defile them. <sup>19</sup>For out of the heart come evil thoughts - murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false testimony, slander. <sup>20</sup>These are what defile a person; but eating with unwashed hands does not defile them."

[The Pharisees] were saying all the right things, doing all the right things. They feared God. But their fear of him—even this interior dimension of worship—was only a doctrine taught by human instruction. It was just an idea, a concept in their minds, a catechetical answer, not a Spirit-imparted awareness transforming their hearts. Beneath the beautiful observance, they were using the worship of God as a mechanism for avoiding God, for controlling God, for setting limits on God... God-evasion can look good... So which do you really prize—tradition or God? You cannot serve two masters. You must choose between authentic worship and pious blasphemy.


