



Interviewer: Maybe Sartre was right; maybe hell really is other people. Maybe we're better off denying ourselves social interaction. And I called you, and the first thing you said is that the question that I was asking touched on what you see as a fundamental paradox at the core of human life. What is that paradox?




That paradox is really just a fundamental tension between the nature of who we are and the choices we often make in our daily lives. On the one hand, we are fundamentally social beings. It's Aristotle who was right when he said that we are by nature social animals. We really need other people in order to get along well in life. He suggested that people who didn't actually need other people were either beasts or gods. We're not beasts or gods; we're people, we're normal people. The only way we get along well in life is through our connections with other people...We're fundamentally social. It affects our health. We're happier when we're connected positively to other people. It is, without question, I think, the biggest determinant of happiness, or at least one of the biggest determinants of our happiness. And so there's that. We're fundamentally social.

And yet, go outside and look around a little bit and watch what we actually do...and what instead you see is a whole bunch of people totally choosing to keep to themselves. There are all these people around them who they could engage with, who they could talk to, and they're choosing not to. So we are, on the one hand, fundamentally social, and yet, on the other, we so often choose to isolate ourselves. And that hits you like a bat to the face if you're a psychologist. Why is it we do that? Why do we make those choices?






