
John 8:12

12 Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.

“What is that lamp? More properly we should ask, who is that lamp? In biblical categories, God Himself (and particularly His law) is referred to as the lamp. But Jesus is speaking here about the light that has come into the world with the breakthrough of the kingdom of God, and the lamp is Jesus Himself. He is saying: “I did not come here to be concealed forever. I came here as a lamp that is to be set on a lampstand, so that the light that I bring may burst forth and manifest itself clearly to all who dwell in darkness. I did not come to be covered with a basket or hidden under a bed. I came to shine forth.”






Mark 4:22-25

The parable of the measure refers to the ways people respond to the light...Those who do not hear well will become the have-nots who lose everything they might have as they become mired deeper in a slough of indifference and ignorance. Those who hear well will get more explanation of God's purposes and will have a superabundance of understanding. The parable contains both a warning and a promise and exhorts the readers to take care how they listen and respond to the word and the light.






Genesis 2:25

25 And the man and his wife were both naked and were not ashamed.

Genesis 3:7-10

7 Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loincloths. 8 And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. 9 But the Lord God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" 10 And he said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself."





Shame is the deep sense that you are unacceptable because of something you did, something done to you, or something associated with you. You feel exposed and humiliated. Or, to strengthen the language, You are disgraced because you acted less than human, you were treated as if you were less than human, or you were associated with something less than human, and there are witnesses.





John 4:23-26

23 But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. 24 God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." 25 The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." 26 Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am he."



It's terrifying because there are certain things I've tried really hard to forget; I'm sure this is true for you too.

But for this woman, "He told me everything I've ever done" is the Gospel. Christ met her amid her sin and failings. ...Jesus offers his life-giving water of grace to this woman, even though he knows full well her sinful past, present, and future.

He doesn't ask her to change. He doesn't give her a list of things to do first. He doesn't count the number of religious points she earned. No, he invites himself into her life, sin and all, and offers her his forgiving grace. He does for her at the well what he does for us at the Cross—while we were still sinners Christ died for us. Died that we might have life. Died that we might be forgiven. Died that we might find grace. Died that we might not be canceled, but reconciled to God and to each other.


What is the way out of shame?

Everything Scripture says about shame converges at Jesus. From his birth to his crucifixion, the shame of the world was distilled to its most concentrated form and washed over him. He was despised, insulted, naked, a friend of sinners, and abandoned by those who knew him best. The crucifixion was not the tragic end of an otherwise charmed life. It was the logical conclusion of the shame he voluntarily accumulated from the moment of his birth.

Gospel Response

Start:

Jesus is offering you his forgiving grace. Associate yourself with him by faith.

Strengthen:

Believe the truth that you don't have to be afraid of bringing things to light with Jesus and with others.
